Focus: Perinatal mood and anxiety disorders, suicidality

Outcomes: Maternal mental health and overall healthcare utilization; delivery-related outcomes; mental health and overall expenditures

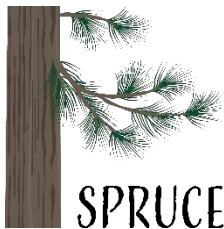


Behavioral health insurance coverage and outcome risks of co-occurring conditions among delivering women with opioid use and pain for the helping to end addiction long-term initiative (R01 MH120124-02S2)

Funding: National Institute of Mental Health; National Institute of Neurological Disorders and Stroke

Focus: Maternal substance use disorders; neonatal abstinence syndrome

Outcomes: Maternal opioid use disorders, use of medications to treat opioid disorder, chronic pain, overdose, suicidality; maternal and infant delivery-related outcomes; maternal and infant utilization and expenditures



State policymaking regarding underserved communities
(R01 MD014958)

Funding: National Institute of Minority Health and Health Disparities

Focus: Patient and community factors contributing to disparities in utilization and delivery outcomes among those with perinatal mood and anxiety disorders

Outcomes: Maternal mental health and overall healthcare utilization; delivery-related outcomes. Evidence-based policymaking guide for perinatal mood and anxiety disorders informed by expert panel and state policymakers



Pregnancy outcomes and private behavioral health insurance coverage changes (R01 MH120124-02S1)

Focus: Severe maternal morbidity and mortality

Outcomes: Severe maternal morbidity and mortality overall and among high-risk subgroups (including mothers with maternal mental health and/or substance use disorders)
